GPS Essentials:

Tuesday 31 January, 9am - 12pm

How to set up a GPS correctly, working with waypoints and tracks to better navigate on-property, measuring areas and distances and how to download and upload information into a property computer mapping program to assist with mapping and regulatory requirements.

Vertebrate pest management:

Tuesday 31 January, 1pm - 4pm

Up-to-date information and practical solutions for coordinated pest control and management including practical tools and information about implementing pest strategies to minimise pest-induced losses to agricultural production and improve biodiversity.

Computer mapping:

Tuesday 7 February, 8.45am - 4pm

New mapping capabilities and foundational computer mapping principles, how to use this technology to improve property management, productivity, infrastructure planning/building, succession planning and to assist with regulative requirements. How to add bio and physical features to maps such as land types and infrastructure and linking GPS for data upload and download.

Leasehold, Native Title and Nature Refuge: Tuesday 28th February, 8.45am - 4pm

An outline of the lease renewal process under the Delbessie Agreement (State Rural Leasehold Land Strategy), how leasehold rents are calculated now and post-2017, approved templates for Indigenous Land Use Agreements (ILUAs) and how to establish and manage a Nature Refuge.
